The State Vital Records Office houses birth, marriage, death, and divorce records from the nineteenth century to 1938, 2002, and 1967, respectively. They also have indexes of these records through 1984, 2012, 2015, and 1986, respectively. Their research room is open Monday through Friday from 8AM-10AM and 10:30AM-12:30PM. **Call to make an appointment before visiting. You must bring personal identification, like a driver's license or state ID.**

The Wisconsin Historical Society's Library and Archives contain pre-1907 vital records, newspapers, plat maps, census records, Civil War enlistment records, family histories, and more. Their vital records index and select digitized materials are available on their website, but all other materials are onsite. The Library and Archives are open Monday through Saturday, but their hours vary; check their website or call to confirm.

ONLINE RESOURCES

FamilySearch.org

Operated by the Family History Library in Salt Lake City, FamilySearch.org is a wide-ranging database containing various types of records, including a vital records index; censuses; passenger lists; and more. They require that you create a **free** account to access their database. Some of their records are only available on microfilm. In those cases, an index is available on the website. FamilySearch is actively digitizing microfilmed materials. Check back later to see if the material has been digitized.

[Ancestry: Library Edition](#) (Library Use) OR [Ancestry.com](#) (Personal Subscription)

Ancestry is one of the most well-known genealogy research sites. Like FamilySearch, it contains myriad records, from censuses to petitions of naturalization to the Social Security Death Index. All of Ancestry's materials are available on Ancestry.com; Ancestry: Library Edition offers limited access. Ancestry: Library Edition is available **free** through the Weyenberg Library; otherwise, individuals may **purchase a subscription** to Ancestry.com.
